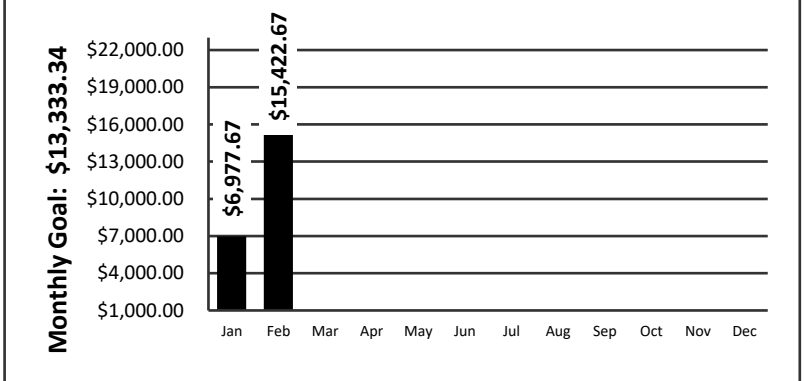
Every World Budget offering is divided amongst several ministries.

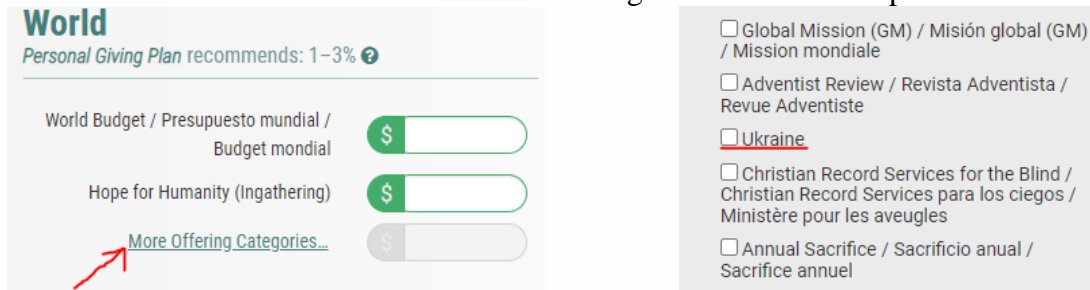

Introducing Small Group Opportunities

A recent study out of Harvard University revealed that over a third of all Americans, and nearly two-thirds of young adults, experience “serious loneliness.” As you can imagine, living through a pandemic has only increased loneliness among us. While we may not be able to conquer the problem of loneliness across the nation, we at least want to ensure that everyone in our Eastgate Church family feels connected.

Why is connection so important? For one, God created humanity to be relational. He said, “It is not good that man should be alone” (Genesis 2:18). Because of our God-given relational nature, the Gospel is powerless to transform lives in a vacuum. Instead, life-transforming discipleship happens within the context of healthy community. This is why small groups are so critical to church life, and this is why we hope to start more small groups for our Eastgate Church family to join.

We know life is already busy, and we don’t want small groups to be yet another item on your ever-growing to-do list. How do we ensure that small group involvement is simple enough not to be burdensome and yet meaningful enough to make a difference? After much prayer, discussion, and consultation with other church leaders who have successfully launched small groups, we have a plan.

We’re currently looking for people to lead small groups that are defined by the following Five S’s:

- **Semester-based.** There will be three small group semesters in a year: fall, spring, and summer. Each semester lasts about twelve weeks, with a one-month rest/promotion period in between each semester. Why semester based? For one, it’s a lot easier to commit to something for twelve weeks than it is to commit to something indefinitely. It also gives leaders a chance to rest and recharge to avoid burnout.
- **Shared Interest.** Each group will gather around a shared interest or passion. There might be a running group, a vegan cooking group, a Revelation study group, or any other group you can think of. This makes it easier to incorporate a small group into your busy life. Joining a group based on shared interest means being able to do what you already enjoy doing, only with a small group of

people. It also allows everyone, regardless of where they are on the faith spectrum, to participate and belong.

- **Spiritual.** Not every group will involve a Bible study or long seasons of prayer. That's okay. Discipleship doesn't only happen while studying the Bible and praying. Discipleship happens whenever and wherever the Spirit moves. We just ask that each leader include a spiritual moment, like a prayer or a brief devotional thought, and give the Spirit room to work while your group is birdwatching, or cooking, or knitting.
- **Social.** Some groups are social by nature, while others are more task oriented. To encourage all groups to connect socially, we ask that each group plan one social event, such as a potluck or a bowling night, during the semester.
- **Service-oriented.** Rounding off the holistic nature of these groups is the service dimension. We encourage each group to find a way to serve the community together at least once during the semester.

Of course, in order to have these types of groups, we first need people willing to lead them. If this sounds like the kind of group you'd be willing to lead, we'd love to hear from you. *We're planning a training session for Sabbath afternoon on March 19 for leaders wanting to lead groups for the summer semester (May through July). Feel free to attend to learn more and ask questions to determine if it's right for you.*

Keeping the financial health of our church in mind ~ Giving Plan

How your local church budget fits into "My Personal Giving Plan"

Like every family, the local church family has financial obligations to meet. Some are easy to see like power and heat, but many are not so obvious: children's magazines, Sabbath School Bible study guides, teaching supplies, staff salaries, cleaning services, church school operating expenses, property insurance, worthy student fund, and community outreach. These are but a few of the costs that must be met month after month as the local church seeks to be a light in the community. Because these

expenses are constant, My Personal Giving Plan recommends that 3-5% of one's income be set aside for the local church budget. This systematic giving ensures that all share both in the blessings and the responsibilities of the local congregation.

The North American Division encourages the use of the "My Personal Giving Plan." This plan was developed as a guideline to assist members in systematic giving. The plan suggests that, in addition to returning 10% of a member's personal income as tithe, certain percentages may be dedicated as offerings to three main categories:

- Local Church Budget: 3-5%
- Conference Advance: 1-2%
(Education, evangelism, VBS, summer camps, and union magazines)
- World Budget: 1-3%

This is an annual event which celebrates freedom of conscience, a heritage and the blessing we received from our Constitutional Founders, but one that requires continual vigilance to maintain.

In harmony with holdings by the U.S. Supreme Court, the Seventh-day Adventist Church believes that government at any level does not have the constitutional right to instruct anyone how to pray, when to pray, and who to pray to, let alone what religion to believe in – if any at all.

The founders of the nation wisely sought to guard against the employment of secular power on the part of the church, with its inevitable result – intolerance and persecution.

Adventist World Radio 360°

Over the last few years, you may have heard the incredible unfolding stories about Adventist World Radio's work in the Philippines. As the ministry beamed the Good News of the Gospel across this country the messages reached into the remote camps of the New People's Arm on the island of Mindoro. These communist soldiers had been fighting the government for over 50 years in an armed conflict that had claimed the lives of more than 40,000 people.

Not only did these messages of hope change the hearts of these hardened soldiers and assassins, but they ended up transforming the trajectory of the country. Just recently, these “Former Rebels” of Mindoro were given amnesty and a new life as they laid down their guns to follow Jesus.

Last November, the Adventist World Radio/General Conference team was given special permission by Philippine President Rodrigo Duterte to visit the country. This large team, led by General Conference President Ted Wilson and AWR President Duane McKey, held evangelistic meetings, a medical clinic and baptisms across the country.

They also met personally with President Duterte, who expressed his gratitude to Adventist World Radio and the Adventist Church for helping to end the communist rebel resistance on the island of Mindoro, bringing about reconciliation.

The reconciliation is making a drastic difference at the national local levels. The chief of police in Mindoro said, “For years we tried everything to end the conflict. We offered to bribe the rebels with food and a stipend, but nothing we did ever worked. In the end, it was through the work of Adventist World Radio that this accomplished.”

The truth is that it was through the power of God. The passion these rebel soldiers once felt for their misguided cause is now being redirected by God's Spirit to a passion for Jesus and His coming Kingdom.
