

The Invisible Driver. We worship God with our resources because He is our sure Deliverer. From his anointing when he was around 15 until his old age, King David had a long and perilous



journey through many dangers. To name a few: there were the lions and the bears, Goliath - the giant, Saul - the envious king, and Absalom - the overly ambitious son. For keeping him safe, David burst into praises, worshiping God as the Rock, the Fortress, and Deliverer.

A missionary family in Madagascar has also experienced God's miraculous protection. One early morning, the family of three, with a nine-month baby, together with some friends, started a 12-hour road trip. Heading West, the sun began to set in front of them. Conversations became sparse, and finally, the only noise was the snoring from the front passenger seat. The driver started feeling sleepy,

but he was determined to reach the destination on time, so he sped up. Then, for a few seconds, he blacked out. A branch violently hit the front windshield. The car was seriously damaged, but miraculously the occupants had only some minor bruises. The baby fell on the small foam mattress that the parents bought the day before. A few meters from where the car stopped, children were playing soccer. They were shocked but not harmed. Later, everyone realized that the vehicle had passed perfectly between two trees. There were ditches on both sides of this road, except where the car left the pavement. The outcome could have been different without the intervention of the Invisible Driver.

The God of David and of the missionary family is not less active today. Do you think that "The Deliverer" deserves our full worship? This week, through our tithe and regular offerings we can worship the Great Deliverer.

Prayer: Lord, we thank You for being our Rock, Fortress, and Deliverer. Help us rest before travel and be alert on the roads. Accept our praises as we honor You with our resources.

Introducing Small Group Opportunities

A recent study out of Harvard University revealed that over a third of all Americans, and nearly two-thirds of young adults, experience "serious loneliness." As you can imagine, living through a pandemic has only increased loneliness among us. While we may not be able to conquer the problem of loneliness across the nation, we at least want to ensure that everyone in our Eastgate Church family feels connected.

Why is connection so important? For one, God created humanity to be relational. He said, "It is not good that man should be alone" (Genesis 2:18). Because of our God-given relational nature, the Gospel is powerless to transform lives in a vacuum. Instead, life-transforming discipleship happens within the context of healthy community. This is why small groups are so critical to church life, and this is why we hope to start more small groups for our Eastgate Church family to join.

We know life is already busy, and we don't want small groups to be yet another item on your evergrowing to-do list. How do we ensure that small group involvement is simple enough not to be burdensome and yet meaningful enough to make a difference? After much prayer, discussion, and consultation with other church leaders who have successfully launched small groups, we have a plan.

We're currently looking for people to lead small groups that are defined by the following Five S's:

- **Semester-based.** There will be three small group semesters in a year: fall, spring, and summer. Each semester lasts about twelve weeks, with a one-month rest/promotion period in between each semester. Why semester based? For one, it's a lot easier to commit to something for twelve weeks than it is to commit to something indefinitely. It also gives leaders a chance to rest and recharge to avoid burnout.
- **Shared Interest.** Each group will gather around a shared interest or passion. There might be a running group, a vegan cooking group, a Revelation study group, or any other group you can think of. This makes it easier to incorporate a small group into your busy life. Joining a group based on shared interest means being able to do what you already enjoy doing, only with a small group of people. It also allows everyone, regardless of where they are on the faith spectrum, to participate and belong.
- **Spiritual.** Not every group will involve a Bible study or long seasons of prayer. That's okay. Discipleship doesn't only happen while studying the Bible and praying. Discipleship happens whenever and wherever the Spirit moves. We just ask that each leader include a spiritual moment, like a prayer or a brief devotional thought, and give the Spirit room to work while your group is birdwatching, or cooking, or knitting.
- **Social.** Some groups are social by nature, while others are more task oriented. To encourage all groups to connect socially, we ask that each group plan one social event, such as a potluck or a bowling night, during the semester.
- **Service-oriented.** Rounding off the holistic nature of these groups is the service dimension. We encourage each group to find a way to serve the community together at least once during the semester.

Of course, in order to have these types of groups, we first need people willing to lead them. If this sounds like the kind of group you'd be willing to lead, we'd love to hear from you. We're planning a training session for Sabbath afternoon on March 19 for leaders wanting to lead groups for the summer semester (May through July). Keeping the financial health of our church in mind ~ Giving Plan

How your local church budget fits into "My Personal Giving Plan"

Like every family, the local church family has financial obligations to meet. Some are easy to see like power and heat, but many are not so obvious: children's magazines, Sabbath School Bible study guides, teaching supplies, staff salaries, cleaning services, church school operating expenses, property insurance, worthy student fund, and community outreach. These are but a few of the costs that must be met month after month as the local church seeks to be a light in the community. Because these expenses are constant, My Personal Giving Plan recommends that 3-5% of one's income be set aside for the local church budget. This systematic giving ensures that all share both in the blessings and the responsibilities of the local congregation.

The North American Division encourages the use of the "My Personal Giving Plan." This plan was developed as a guideline to assist members in systematic giving. The plan suggests that, in addition to returning 10% of a member's personal income as tithe, certain percentages may be dedicated as offerings to three main categories:

Local Church Budget: 3-5%Conference Advance: 1-2%

(Education, evangelism, VBS, summer camps, and union magazines)

• World Budget: 1-3%
