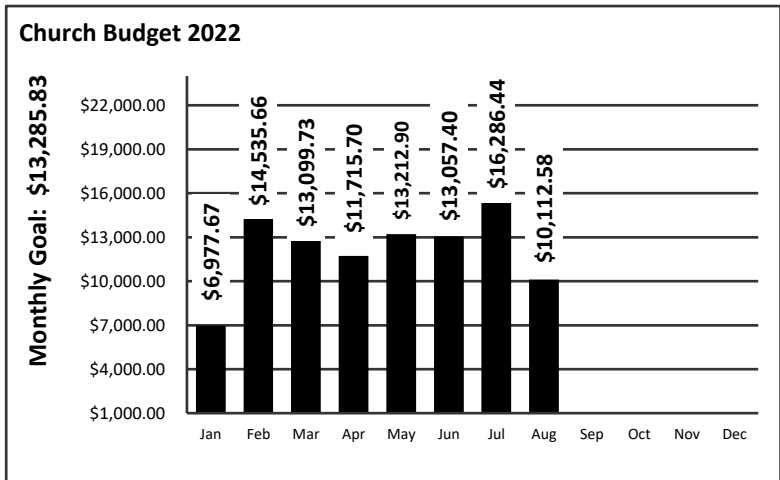

Appeal: 2 Chronicles 29:3 “In the first month of the first year of his reign, he opened the doors of the temple of the Lord and repaired them.”

A Time of Spiritual Revival. We worship God with our resources because we are in a time of revival. Ellen G. White wrote: “A revival of true godliness among us is the greatest and most urgent of all our needs.”—True Revival, p. 9.

Revival is an invitation to turn away from other gods and acknowledge Him as the sole Lord of our lives. The book of 2 Chronicles 29-31 tells us about the revival during the time of King Hezekiah: The temple was repaired. The worship services were restored. Passover was celebrated once again. Levites were reinstated to ministry. Restoration of true worship was at the heart of true revival. The people’s response to the call to revival comprised of a concrete element: “Then Hezekiah said, “You have now dedicated yourselves to the



Lord. Come and bring sacrifices and thank offerings to the temple of the Lord. So the assembly brought sacrifices and thank offerings, and all whose hearts were willing brought burnt offerings.” (2 Chr. 29:31). Spiritual revival acknowledges God as Lord, and one tangible means is to honor Him with our gifts. The story of Zacchaeus in the New Testament presents giving as a result of true spiritual revival. Before welcoming Jesus as his guest of honor, Zacchaeus was the greediest man in Jericho. He was ready to betray his country, lose his friends, forsake his religion, and sacrifice his reputation for just a little more. However, when salvation entered his house, he was prompted to give more than what he owed: “I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount” (Lk. 19:8). That was his love response to the love he received from Jesus. We can give without loving, but we cannot love without giving. The call for a spiritual revival is resounding loud in our churches. This week as we worship with our tithe and regular offerings would it show that the revival message has taken root in our hearts?

Prayer: Lord, help us to respond to Your call of revival through prayers, singing, giving, and dedicated life.

Camp Wooten All Church Retreat ~ September 16 – 18

About the Facilities:

Camp Wooten is located on the Tucannon River in the Blue Mountains. There is a softball field, paved court for tennis and basketball, hiking available on forested and mountain trails, canoeing on Donnie Lake (canoes provided, flotation devices welcome – this is really more of a pond than a lake). Horse shoe pits are available, bring your own horse shoes. We are working on providing archery also!

Accommodations:

There is a 1930's era dining hall with fully equipped modern kitchen, 17 cabins that each sleep 11; cedar meeting hall with fireplace; several outdoor shelters; and restrooms and showers nearby. For those wanting to bring their RV's or trailers, there are only 3 maybe 4 sites with partial hook-ups of water, sewer and electricity.

Cabins: Most of the cabins are set up for summer camp style with single bunk beds. Bring your own bedding. Most cabins do not have bathroom facilities in them. There are communal shower/toilet facilities in two locations.

Tents: There are two specific locations where tents are welcome to be pitched. The lawn near the baseball field is not one of these locations. Please confirm tent site locations before you pitch your tent ~ Thank you!

Refrigeration: There is a glass front refrigerator which campers may place their personal food items in. The large commercial refrigerators will be used for the communal foods.

Kitchen: Sabbath morning you may use areas of the kitchen for preparing and sharing your breakfast. We ask you to be sure to clean up those areas, wash utensils and return them to their storage locations ~ Thank you.

Cost:

The rate for the weekend is: \$10.00 per person per night = \$20 for a single person for the weekend. For a couple it would be \$40 for the weekend. For a Family of four or more = \$80 for the weekend. (Mom & Dad with kids = one family unit.) Grandpa & Grandma = a couple, \$40. For those coming out just for the day the rate is \$5.00 per person. We do get charged for everyone who comes into the park. Payments are to be made to the church with a note indicating for Camp Wooten Weekend. Payment prior to the weekend would be appreciated. We would like everyone to be able to go, if this price is a financial hardship, contact Carol Hargreaves or the Pastor for special arrangements.

Food: There will some sign-up sheets in the lobby with specific items requested for specific meals.

Friday Supper: Baked Potato Bar. Please bring toppings to enhance a baked potato!

Sabbath Breakfast: There will be a special treat presented by Carol Hargreaves. However, families should plan to bring their favorite milk or milk substitute, cereal or other main breakfast items.

Sabbath Lunch: We will be having "Haystacks". Beans will be provided. We will ask you all to sign up for and bring other items to compliment this meal. Please see the list in the lobby/foyer of the church.

Sabbath Supper: We will fire up a large outdoor grill. You are invited to bring your family favorite "meats" for hotdogs or veggie burgers/grillers etc. The church will provide bread for hot dogs or burgers. Sign-ups will include condiments. Please see the list in the lobby/foyer of the church.

Sunday Breakfast: Breakfast will be prepared by the men of the church.

Study on Leadership and Polarization Released

Ministry leaders of all stripes have increasingly had to navigate the reality of polarized views within their communities and congregations. For instance, Barna Group recently learned that one of the main reasons some pastors are thinking about leaving full-time ministry is political division. New Barna research raises questions about a more divided America. Comparing a June 2022 survey to data collected in 2015, Barna found growing inconsistencies in U.S. adults' willingness to discuss important topics with others and to examine their own views. There's a remarkable story in the Book of Acts that describes what can happen when the church prays.

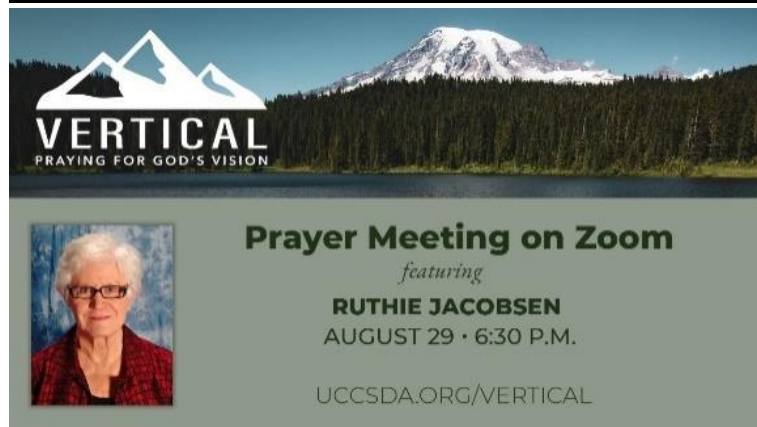
King Herod Agrippa had cast James, the brother of John, into prison, and sent an executioner to kill him with the sword. Seeing that many people in Jerusalem were pleased with this, he then decided to imprison Peter also.

However, when Herod sent a squadron of sixteen soldiers to arrest Peter the entire church began to pray for his release. Acts 12:5 says, "So Peter was kept in prison, but the church was earnestly praying to God for him."

In other words, they began to pray without ceasing for Peter, for they knew that he could not be spared from God's cause. They began to realize that they had reached a place in time, that without the special help of God, the church would not survive.
