A message from elder Rob Becker

A viticulturist – that is, one who tends grape vines in the vineyards – once asked a Pastor if he understood John 15*. The Pastor had always been a little troubled by the verse which states, “Every branch in me that does not bear fruit, He [the Father – the vinedresser] takes away”. So, he answered, “Not completely, why?”

The man explained that he owned a vineyard and wished to share his insights related to this very verse and its meaning. The Pastor was intrigued and immediately cleared his schedule for the afternoon.

You see, in John 15:2, the word translated as “takes away” is, in Greek, *airo*. It may also be translated as “take up” or “lift up”. In Matthew 14:20, the disciples “took up” (*airo*) twelve baskets of food after Jesus fed the five thousand. As Jesus staggered under the weight of the cross, Simon of Cyrene, was forced to “take up” (*airo*) the cross of Christ.

The Pastor listened attentively as the vine grower spoke. “New vines”, he explained, “have a tendency to trail down and grow along the ground; but they don’t bear fruit down there. They soon get coated in dust or mud, or become sick due to mildew.”

“So, what do you do? Cut them off?”, the Pastor queried.

“Oh no!”, he exclaimed, “they are much too valuable for that! We go through the vineyard and lift them up, gently clean them off, and carefully ‘train’ them to the trellis, where they are soon flourishing.”

What a beautiful picture of God. For the soul languishing in sin, He gently “lifts us up”, cleans us off, and nurtures us that we may live fruitful and productive lives to His glory.

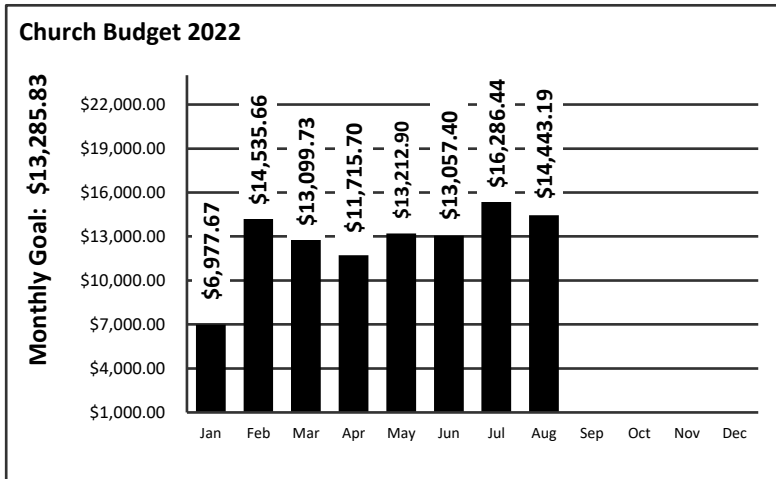

Appeal: Malachi 3:10 “Test me in this,” says the Lord Almighty, “and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it.”

A Matter of Trust. We worship with our resources because it is a means of trusting God. God's instructions about soil management in Leviticus 25:3-4 is an example of God's invitation for His children to trust Him: “For six years sow



your fields, and for six years prune your vineyards and gather their crops. But in the seventh year the land is to have a year of sabbath rest, a sabbath to the LORD. Do not sow your fields or prune your vineyards.” We now know some of the benefits of putting the land to rest through knowledge acquired in Agricultural science. In those days, after receiving such an unusual instruction, the Israelites would surely wonder what they would eat in the seventh year if they did not plant or harvest. It was an

invitation to trust. Interestingly, there are no reported instances where someone died of starvation for keeping this strange command. God's order was backed up by a promise, "Follow my decrees and be careful to obey my laws, and you will live safely in the land." On one occasion, a pastor accompanied by an elder visited a low-income family of the church. They were gladly welcomed and had a great time fellowshiping together. At some point, the pastor opened the Bible and read Malachi 3:9-10, encouraging the family about faithfulness in giving. Upon completing their visit, the elder shared with the pastor that he was much uncomfortable about the text he read because this family was struggling financially. Gently, but firmly the pastor responded: "I wanted to make sure that they are not missing God's blessings." Have you ever gone through situations where His instructions do not make any sense to you? Remember the words of the hymnal: "Trust and obey, for there's no other way to be happy in Jesus."

Prayer: Lord, we thank You for the opportunity we have each new week to sharpen our confidence in You. Increase our faith and thank You for fulfilling Your promises.

Camp Wooten All Church Retreat ~ September 16 – 18

About the Facilities:

Camp Wooten is located on the Tucannon River in the Blue Mountains. There is a softball field, paved court for tennis and basketball, hiking available on forested and mountain trails, canoeing on Donnie Lake (canoes provided, flotation devices welcome – this is really more of a pond than a lake). Horse shoe pits are available, bring your own horse shoes. We are working on providing archery also!

Accommodations:

There is a 1930's era dining hall with fully equipped modern kitchen, 17 cabins that each sleep 11; cedar meeting hall with fireplace; several outdoor shelters; and restrooms and showers nearby. For those wanting to bring their RV's or trailers, there are only 3 maybe 4 sites with partial hook-ups of water, sewer and electricity.

Cabins: Most of the cabins are set up for summer camp style with single bunk beds. Bring your own bedding. Most cabins do not have bathroom facilities in them. There are communal shower/toilet facilities in two locations.

Tents: There are two specific locations where tents are welcome to be pitched. The lawn near the baseball field is not one of these locations. Please confirm tent site locations before you pitch your tent ~ Thank you!

Refrigeration: There is a glass front refrigerator which campers may place their personal food items in. The large commercial refrigerators will be used for the communal foods.

Kitchen: Sabbath morning you may use areas of the kitchen for preparing and sharing your breakfast. We ask you to be sure to clean up those areas, wash utensils and return them to their storage locations ~ Thank you.

Cost:

The rate for the weekend is: \$10.00 per person per night = \$20 for a single person for the weekend. For a couple it would be \$40 for the weekend. For a Family of four or more = \$80 for the weekend. (Mom & Dad with kids = one family unit.) Grandpa & Grandma = a couple, \$40. For those coming out just for the day the rate is \$5.00 per person. We do get charged for everyone who comes into the park. Payments are to be made to the church with a note indicating for Camp Wooten Weekend. Payment prior to the weekend would be appreciated. We would like everyone to be able to go, if this price is a financial hardship, contact Carol Hargreaves or the Pastor for special arrangements.

Food: There are sign-up sheets in the lobby with specific items requested for specific meals.

Friday Supper: Baked Potato Bar. Please bring toppings to enhance a baked potato!

Sabbath Breakfast: There will be a special treat presented by Carol Hargreaves. However, families should plan to bring their favorite milk or milk substitute, cereal or other main breakfast items.

Sabbath Lunch: We will be having "Haystacks". Beans will be provided. We will ask you all to sign up for and bring other items to compliment this meal. Please see the list in the lobby/foyer of the church.

Sabbath Supper: We will fire up a large outdoor grill. You are invited to bring your family favorite "meats" for hotdogs or veggie burgers/grillers etc. The church will provide bread for hot dogs or burgers. Sign-ups will include condiments. Please see the list in the lobby/foyer of the church.

Sunday Breakfast: Breakfast will be prepared by the men of the church.

Please Remember we are requesting that *the camp use fee* for you (and families) **be submitted prior** to the weekend. If cost is a special concern, please discuss with Carol Hargreaves or Pastor Eric.

There's a remarkable story in the Book of Acts that describes what can happen when the church prays.



However, when Herod sent a squadron of sixteen soldiers to arrest Peter the entire church began to pray for his release. Acts 12:5 says, "So Peter was kept in prison, but the church was earnestly praying to God for him."

In other words, they began to pray without ceasing for Peter, for they knew that he could not be spared from God's cause. They began to realize that they had reached a place in time, that without the special help of God, the church would not survive.
