1 ~The impending hopelessness stared by at a girl child even before she was born. Her mother was threatened with dire consequences if she did not change her faith to her husbands. Her choice was to love God unconditionally and so she was left to raise her newborn baby girl on her own. With no source of income the child and mother faced an uncertain future because of a choice. A choice and a faith that would leave ripples of hope for their future. ...

~2 ~A 12 year old girl from a remote village was waiting to take her final breath. Her parents had given up hope, her village had given up hope, she was abandoned and left to die with a fatal skin disease.

A choice was made to shift to her against the will of the village to the newly opened Adventist Mission Hospital where she began her treatment. Complications arose and she was shifted to various other hospitals only to be met with the same answer. Why go through all the trouble to save her?

As days turned into weeks and weeks turned into months, Simrichi began a slow painful recovery. Her only source of constant support was the ever prayerful staff of the Adventist Mission Hospital. On hearing of her miraculous healing, many local villagers came forward for bible studies. And, today, almost the entire village have accepted the Adventist message.

A choice was made, a choice that turned Simrichi into a living testimony, showing the true power of prayer.

~ A parent chooses to leave his family because he has only girls.

~ A family moves away to ease their financial burdens, leaving their children behind.

~ The village and the parents want nothing to do with a child because the child has given his heart to the Lord. Any yet in the face of these bad positions, a door was opened because someone made a choice.

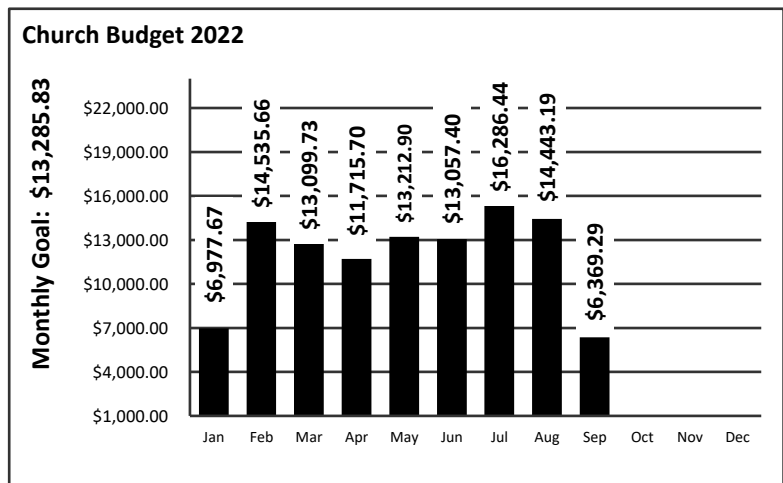

Appeal: John 15:4 “Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.”

Bear Fruits. We worship God with our resources as a response to the call to bear fruits. John the Baptist appealed to those who were coming to him for baptism: “Produce fruit in keeping with repentance.” (Matt. 3:8). For John,

baptism and being part of God’s people were not sufficient. The Gospel of Luke shares some concrete examples of the “fruit of repentance” that John the Baptist gave to those who came to him. He asked



the tax collector not to collect any more than was required. He exhorted the soldiers not to “extort money” and “be content with your pay.” And he commanded the crowd to share their second shirt and food with the one who does not have (Lk. 3: 10-14). These examples reported by Luke have something in common; they are related to one’s attitudes towards finances and material possessions. Fruit of repentance comprises being careful about the means used to obtain resources and using our resources to bless others. The Bible tells the story of a man, Nabal, a son of Abraham who was heavily blessed but did not bear fruit of repentance in his material life. He refused to reward those who protected his flock and would harshly rebuke the servants of David who came to ask for some food. This attitude led his wife to call him wicked and to make the following comment: “He is just like his name—his name means Fool, and folly goes with him” (1 Sam. 25:25). Sadly, the following day, he had a stroke. Ten days later, he died. As we reflect on the need to bear more fruits of repentance in our material life, let us apply the advice of Jesus: “Remain in me as I also remain in you.” The result would be beyond expectation. This week, as we worship with our tithe and regular offerings we can bear fruits of repentance.

Prayer: Lord, we want to bear fruits of repentance in all aspects of life. Please help us to remain connected with You daily through regular prayer and bible study.


