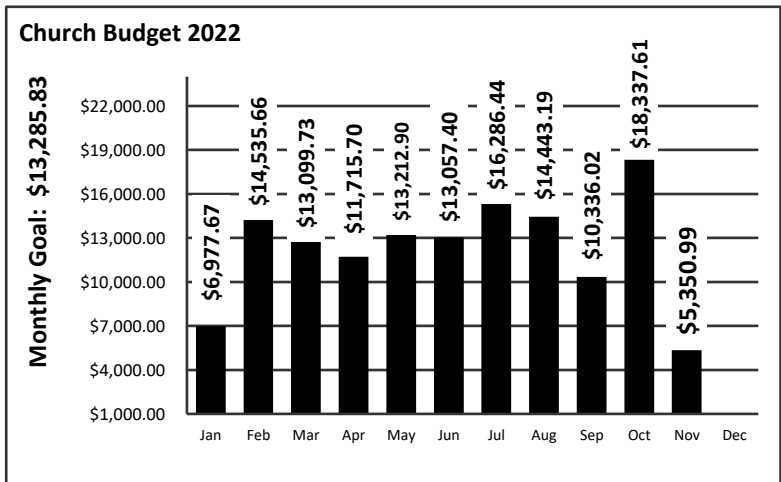

Annual Sacrifice for Global Missions

Appeal: John 6 :12 “When they had all had enough to eat, he said to his disciples, “Gather the pieces that are left over. Let nothing be wasted.”

We can worship with our resources when we follow God's instructions about the economy and savings. In several instances, God has taught the practice of saving to His children. He inspired Joseph, the son of Jacob, to advise Pharaoh not to eat everything

during the seven years of abundance but to keep 20% for later. On the night the Israelites had to celebrate the first Passover, before leaving Egypt, God's first instruction was for them to choose the right size of lamb according to the number of people in each family. At the end of the multiplication of bread and fish, the clear admonition was “let nothing be wasted.” “The wise store up choice food and olive oil, but fools gulp theirs down” (Prov. 21:20). This same message about penny-wise is



pertinent in many places today. We are preparing and eating more than what we need daily, buying more than what we need to wear, and building houses with far more space than what we need to live. This consumption-oriented society influences us to adopt a criterion other than the need to acquire goods: affordability. If I can pay for it with available or borrowed money, there is no problem with purchasing it. This can be socially acceptable but is this good stewardship? Saving will help us to prepare for life emergencies, realize major financial goals, prepare for retirement, leave a financial legacy, and in some cases, break the cycle of poverty. Furthermore, we will be in a better position to partner in God's mission. Jesus and His missionary crew were supported by a group of women who used their own means (Lk. 8:3). The Early Church members, whose wealth was in the form of lands and houses, sold their properties to provide for the beginning of the Christians' mission (Acts 4:34-35). Ellen G. White challenges us to properly channel our resources: "Each should keep a missionary box at hand, and drop into it every penny he is tempted to waste in self-indulgence." — Ellen G. White, *Counsels on Stewardship*, p. 291. Is it not time to identify and fix the leakages in our financial lives? This week we have another opportunity to use our savings to worship God by bringing our tithe and regular offerings to Him.

Prayer: Lord, You have designed us to enjoy an abundant life and to partner with You. Please give us the wisdom to manage our resources.

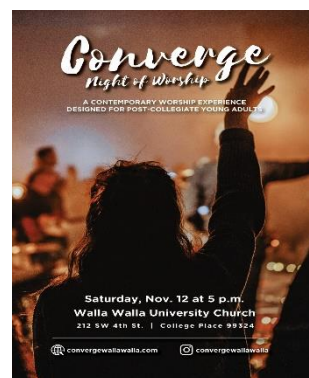
Sabbath Morning Bible Study

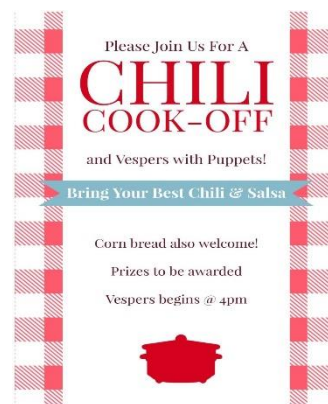

Isaac Peterson, Student Pastor 2022-2023

Have you met our new Student Pastor yet? I sat down with him and asked a few questions. I hope this helps you get to know him a bit better.

So Isaac, where are you from?

I am originally from Northern California, not far from Auburn where I attended Pine Hills Adventist Academy for high-school and later went to Pacific Union College for Emergency Services. I started California fire training, I did some search and rescue work but before I completed that degree I turned my focus to ministry. I interned as

a youth pastor/worship pastor at the Paradise SDA Church for two summers and decided to pursue pastoral ministry by going back to school at Andrews University. I was there for a relatively short time and then decided to be closer to home, my girlfriend, and to save money I recently transferred to Walla Walla University where I will finish my Theology degree come 2024.

There was mention of a girl friend in that response. Do you want to tell us any more about that subject?

Well, I met her while on a mission trip. She is wonderful and this relationship is still under development.

Were you a student leader in your Academy experience? Hold offices in ASB or class officer, anything of that nature?

I was class pastor at Pine Hills Adventist Academy all 4 years of high school and was Religious Vice President my senior year.

Our Pastor Eric was a Wrangler while at Big Lake, Oregon. Did you ever work at a summer camp?

I never worked at a camp but I was a worship leader and staff member for Maranatha Ultimate Workout trips :) SIDE NOTE: The Ultimate Workout is a unique mission project designed for teenagers in high school. Stripped of electronics, parents, and other familiar comforts, volunteers step into the mission field in search of a fresh perspective on the world, relationships, and God. During the project, volunteers live in spartan conditions while building a church or school, coordinating outreach for the local community, and strengthening their personal connection to Jesus Christ. The Ultimate Workout is Maranatha's most adventurous project—and the most popular!

So to get a glimpse of how you grew up, what was the first job you ever were hired for?

My first paying job, I think it was working as a warehouse worker at a feed store in California bucking hay and loading horse feed!

Do you know what specific area(s) of our church you will be working in or with?

My official duties include aiding in pastoral care, some leadership in music – mostly with the youth and young adult groups. Also Pastor Eric will include me in a variety of church functions so I can continue to build experience in church organization practices and procedures.

You already seem to have a bit of experience in pastor type of work. What is/are your personal goal(s) as you go through this Eastgate/WWU experience?

I want to further develop my experience in youth ministry in a way that establishes empowerment of leadership within the youth themselves and in stating mentorship from the young adults down to the youth. I also want to further understand some nuance pastoral skills where I have less experience; like baptismal studies, leading bible studies and starting study/support groups.

Where do you see yourself once you have completed your year here with us at Eastgate and as you complete your Theology Degree here at WWU?

I plan to go where God leads me but for now I hope to primarily focus on music ministry and youth mentorship.

What are some of your personal interests and ways you like to spend your recreation time? Are you a team sport person or more of an individual recreational individual?

I am an active outdoors enthusiast and can be caught mountain biking, rock climbing, backpacking, running etc. I also enjoy overlanding and rock crawling especially when I can be behind a camera and develop quality photo/video content. I am a songwriter/music performer who also enjoys podcasting and interviewing people. Traveling is also at the top of the list and being able to do all those side hobbies while in a plane or car in whatever country or state; that's a good time! So for recreation? Bike, run, bike, drive, and bike!
