We invite you to bring your brunch specialties to share: Fruit Plates, Egg bakes, Potato dishes, Sweet Breads of all varieties are encouraged!

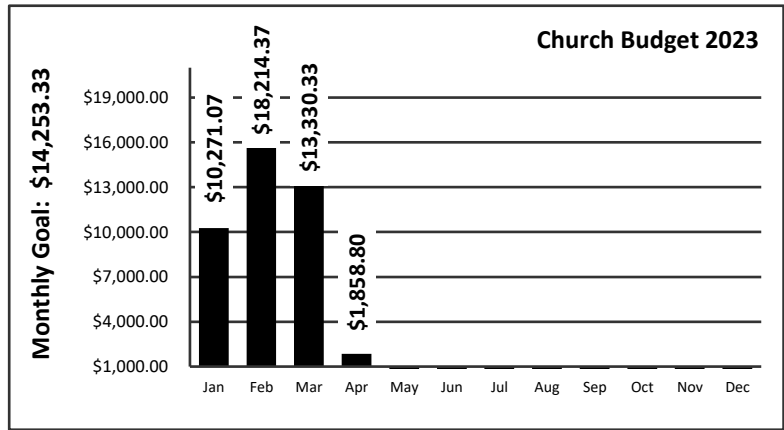
Thank you for helping to take care of our church
